


1. The syllabus has been upgraded as per industry requirements?







1. The syllabus has been upgraded as per industry requirements?

1% of the Alumni Strongly agreed that the syllabus has been upgraded as per industry requirements,64 % agreed,13 % said its neutral and 6% disagree and Strongly Disagreed respectively.
